THE DEGREE PROGRAM

The Adventure West Council's University of Scouting Degree Program is designed to provide you with the tools and knowledge that can be gained through supplemental training to help reinforce your Scouting knowledge and experience. Participation in the Degree Program is voluntary and adherence to the degree requirements is totally the responsibility of the participant.

The College's Degree Program provides a structured process in which participants can advance and be rewarded with degrees for each level of achievement. They may also gain a stronger sense of self-worth and a better understanding of their increasing value to the Scouting community.

The atmosphere is one of fun and fellowship, but there's also an attitude of respect for the importance of the event. Remember, every youth deserves a trained Leader. Students are encouraged to return each year, not only to earn higher degrees, but also to share their experiences with fellow students. The atmosphere of camaraderie and school spirit invigorates the students, inspiring them to return to their units and share their enthusiasm with Scouts and other adult leaders. The college's degree program is designed to provide an incentive for continued training and as a method to recognize Scouters who participate in that training.

Bachelor of Science in Scouting

1. Be a registered Scouter
2. Have current Youth Protection Training for your registered position.
3. Complete basic BSA training for your registered position (Trained Patch)
4. Complete or teach six (6) AWC University of Scouting or College of Commissioner Science courses.

Master of Science in Scouting

1. Be a registered Scouter
2. Have current Youth Protection Training for your registered position
3. Hold an Bachelor Degree (or equivalent) from AWC or other University of Scouting
4. Complete basic BSA training for your registered position (Trained Patch)
5. Complete or teach six (6) AWC University of Scouting or College of Commissioner Science courses for a total of twelve (12) courses:
 - a. Attend a minimum of three (3) new courses
 - b. Attend three (3) courses from the College of Commissioner Science

Course Offerings

CSP 101 – Cub Scouting Leader Position Specific

Venturing Adult Program (VAP)

Course Offerings

VAP 100 – Introduction to Venturing

This course is an introduction to Venturing, whether you are a seasoned scouter or brand new to the program, come learn about Scouting America's Older Youth Program. This course will quickly cover the basics of Crew structure, advancement, leadership, and offer ample time to ask questions. (This course is for both youth and adults)

VAP 101 – Venturing Leader Basic Training [P21]

Start your journey as a Venturing leader with the foundational knowledge you need to succeed! This course provides a comprehensive introduction to the Venturing program, covering the basics of youth leadership, crew organization, and advancement. Ideal for new leaders or those wanting to learn more about Venturing, this training will equip you with the essential tools and confidence to help guide Venturers on their path to success. Whether you're stepping into a leadership role for the first time or looking to refresh your skills, this session is the perfect starting point.

VAP 502 – Effective Teen Mentorship

This training is based on the research and writings of Dr. David Yeager, a professor of psychology at the University of Texas at Austin. This course will quickly cover many deep topics concerning teens today such as motivation, engagement, bullying, stress, mental health, and more. The youth we work with face different challenges than many of us experienced growing up. This course will aim to equip you with some tools and approaches that will hopefully guide your work as an adult mentor to youth.

Venturing Youth Program (VYP)

Course Offerings

(subject to change, depending on level of interest and faculty availability)

VYP 201 - Crew Officer Orientation [SCO_115]

This training will help your Crew understand the roles and duties of Crew officers and how to properly plan meetings and events. You will become familiar with the responsibilities of Venturing officers and with Crew processes. Participants will also review and compare several model agendas for Crew meetings and build an awareness of what makes an agenda type appropriate to a particular Crew need. In short, the Crew Officers Orientation helps Crew members understand their roles, the Crew's operations, and how to lead the Crew to success. Successful completion of this course is required for advancement to the Discovery Rank

VYP 202 – Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews (ILSC) [P35]

The Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews Course (ILSC) will help Venturers learn and practice the attitudes and skills that good leaders demonstrate. The course is a series of lessons divided into three modules: Leading Self, Leading Others, and Leading Crews. Successful completion of this course earns Venturers the *Trained* patch and is required for advancement to the Discovery Rank

VYP 203 - Goal Setting and Time Management [P36]

Finding a successful time management strategy depends on each individual's personality, ability to self-motivate, and level of self-discipline. This course introduces established methods for improving a Venturer's ability to effectively manage a daily timeline in his or her life. Successful completion of this course is required for advancement to the Discovery Rank

VYP 401 – Mentoring [P38]

This training is designed to help Venturers understand how to mentor other members of the crew and appreciate the role mentoring plays in personal growth and leadership for both the mentee and mentor. After completing this training, an experienced Venturer will be able to successfully mentor a less-experienced Venturer through the planning and execution of a crew adventure. Successful completion of this course is required for advancement to the Summit Rank.

VYP 501- VOA: Venturing at the Council, Territory, and National Level

Venturing is run locally and nationally by youth leaders. As District, Council, Territory, and National officers, these young adults and teens work hard to shape the future of the program. Learn about this structure, how it makes Venturing a more powerful program, and how to get involved. (This course is for both youth and adults)

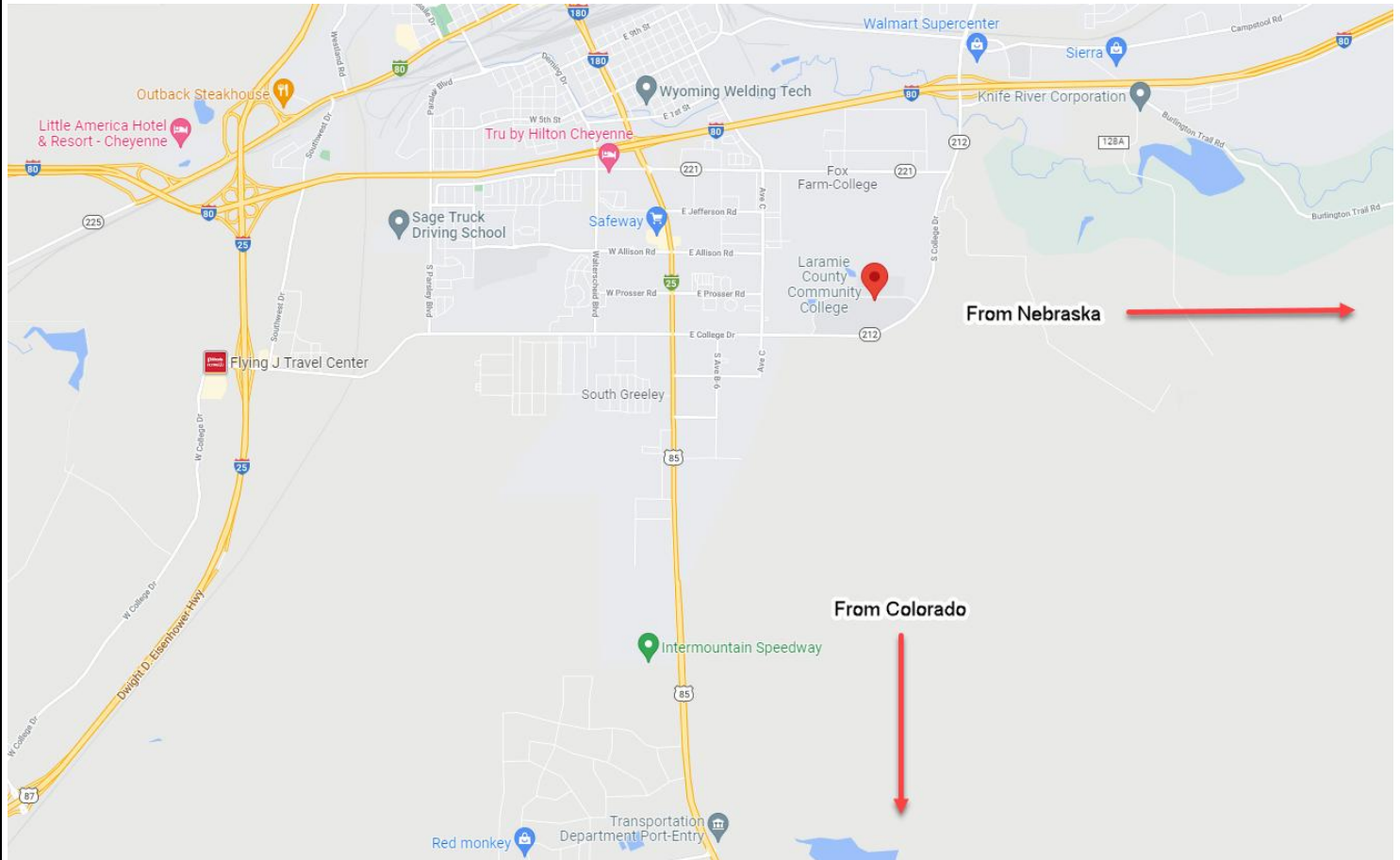
